The development of the Fier Municipality will be guided by the principles of sustainable development and focuses on the economic and social well-being of its citizens. Fier is one of the most important industrial cities in Albania. Situated alongside Gjanica tributary of the Seman river, it is widely surrounded by marshland. Fier is conveniently located near major archeological or other historical sites part of Albania's heritage with some of the most frequented nearby such as Byllis and Apolonia.


Fier coastline is about 48 km, and extends through the villages Seman, Povelce, Ndernenas, Pishe-Poro and Darzeze. Estuaries of Seman, Viosa and Shkumbini, can be utilized for beach, water sports or hunting, due to natural reserves and national parks located nearby.

The whole area of Fier on the coast (comprising the Lagoon of Gjemia, Dellinja lake, the bog of Lacaj, the small lake of Sllaniku and the Bay of Seman), is quite unused, with hardly any construction development, leaving it ecologically pure and a valuable resource for the use of nature tourism. Maritime pines, the Godulla lagoons, river's deltas, the clean sand, the hot sun, the clean air and healthy nature, represent a powerful potential for future tourism development.

Fier is also known for the production of oranges, lemons, olives, ect. The population is mixed Orthodox and Muslim (typical of southern Albanian cities). Fier is also at the crossroad of many national roads network, being at an optimal position between north and south.



Employment by economic sector in county




Employment by economic sector in municipality

Unemployment by education








